Agriculture and Animal Husbandry

Agriculture

GHCL Foundation Trust is working with farmers to make them aware of better techniques of farming that will help them achieve higher productivity at a lower cost.



- Introduced agricultural program in the areas near Salt Marine and Chemical Division (SMCD).
- Approx 150 farmers participated in the meeting conducted in three villages of the region.

Agriculture and Animal Husbandry

- 2509 kits of Vegetable seeds and 1130 kits for Biocontrol measures were distributed.
- Agricultural demonstration were given at Karambela village for Bio products, 1 farmer have also started Honey Bee Cultivation.
- Approximately 40 farmers benefitted from the exposure visit to Shri Shri Ravishankar's seminar on organic farming and Zero budget agriculture.
- GHCL Foundation Trust initiated soil and water testing in the region in order to access the potential for organic farming.
 - 250 water and soil samples were collected for analysis from 99 villages.
- GHCL Foundation Trust is helping farmers who have been practicing organic farming for more than three years to achieve certificate of authenticity.



Agriculture and Animal Husbandry

Animal Husbandry



GHCL Foundation Trust provides nutrition kits to supplement cattle feeds that helps to enhance milk yield in cattles.

A kit includes:

- 1. Calcium 2 liters
- 2. Mineral-mixture powder 2 kg
- 3. Fenlyfe Bolus 3 tablets
- 4. Prolyfe Bolus 12 tablets

In the last quarter, approximately 1600 kits were distributed to:

- 1200 farmers from 45 villages in Sutrapada.
- 58 farmers from 8 villages in Port Victor.
- 338 farmers from 18 villages in Khambha.

Healthcare



GHCL Foundation Trust in a joint venture with Rita Radia Foundation have started a special project "Timely Detection, Secure Life".

This initiative focuses on detection of 'Breast and Cervical Cancer' within women in the age group of 35+ years and provides facilities of preliminary tests in their village.

- In the third quarter, 165 women from 16 villages were examined.

Camp was organised at GHCL - Sutrapada, for 200 suspected cases:

- (a) 163 women have been checked by MS Gaynae Cancer from Salbi Hospital, Ahmedabad along with her team.
- (b) 43 women were identified for second level tests.

Education and Vocational Training

GHCL Foundation Trust is taking various initiatives that aims at improving the quality of education for children at Pre-Primary, Primary and Higher Secondary levels.



- 168 Anganwadi workers have been trained in Sutrapada for giving quality education to pre-primary kids.
- 1067 parents participated in training sessions that were conducted to build their capacity in childcare.
- 204 students benefitted from career counselling program organised for 10th and 12th students. Total 3 Govt. High School in Kadiyali, Lothpur and Vadhera village were covered.

Education and Vocational Training

The team at GHCL Foundation trust is diligently working for developing skills among youth population.

In the third quarter, many such programs were implemented.

Jafrabad Vocational Training Centre (VTC)

- Approx 50 parent participated in the meet for electrician, BPO and nursing trade focusing on creating a mind set to support their children after placement.
- 16 students participated in the exposure visit organised for electric trade to Shri Shantiben Haribhai Gujari Engineering College, Amreli.
- 7 students participated in exposure visit organised for Fitter Trade student to Rajkot's Jyoti CNC Automation Limited.
- 18 Nursing trade trainees were taken to Hemkunt Hospital, Mahuwa for exposure visit.



Education and Vocational Training

- 3 villages were surveyed for student mobilization and approx 550 unemployes youths were identified for VTC enrollment.
- 7 students also received Rs. 1500/- as stipend for practical training session organised for nursing trade students in Talaja's Nice General Hospital and Surat's Nice Hospital.

Bhilad Vocational Training Center (VTC)

138 students benefitted from the exposure visit to Bhilad Vocational Institute, PG Garments, Umargam, GHCL Limited, Bhilad, VKM Industry-Umargam and Welspun India Limited. The objective of visit was to give exposure of manufacturing process.



Women Empowerment

Various initiatives are being under taken for development of women residing near the areas GHCL Operation.

- Anganwadi workers were taken for exposure visit to Daxinamurti Vidyalaya Bhavnagar to train them on methods of teaching children.
- Visit was organised for Anganwadi women to Saurashtra Rural
 Development Institute at Bhavnagar to show them successful SHG model.
- SHG Women were taken to KVK Bhavnagar where they were given training to make mosquito repellent coil by using cow urine as an effective ingredient.
- GHCL Foundation trust provides revolving funds for supporting the identified entrepreneurs who are capable of running their own start-ups based on the training received for skill development.



Others

Cyclone relief camp was arranged for supporting residents of 7 villages near Vedaranyam, Tamil Nadu by Veda Salt Works during 'Cyclone Gaja'.

- The camp gave support for a month where 3000 people were provided with essentials like Grocery, Drinking Water, fuel, transportation etc.

- 77 members participated in safety awareness training session organised in Yarn Division on 'Safety Rules and Causes of Accident' on 30th November 2018 in joint venture with joint venture with department of Industrial Safety and Health, Government of Tamil Nadu.
- Session on Hand Injury Prevention was organised on 20th November 2018 by Mr. Mukesh Kumar Singh (AGM -Safety) at at Yarn Division.
- 52 employees were trained on Incident Investigation Methodology organised by Mr. Mukesh Kumar Singh (AGM Safety) at all locations (Chennai / Vapi / Sutrapada / Madurai).



 Training programme on 'Safety and Awareness' was organised in Sutrapada for contractor, supervisors and company technicians. The session was sponsored by Govt. of Gujarat.



 Contractor supervisor meet was organised in Sutrapada on 31st October 2018 and 5th December 2018 to discuss contractor evaluation system and minimising unsafe practices inside the Plant Premises



◆ 25 security members participated in training on 'Fire safety' organised in Home Textiles Division on 12th November 2018.



 Awareness session on Diabetes was organised in Home Textiles Division 14th November 2018 with theme on "the Family and Diabetes."



- 350 employees participated in 'Awareness Session on Aids' in Home Textiles Division on 1st December 2018.
- 61 first aiders benefitted from the First aid training conducted in Home Textiles Division that addressed various first aid issues in the plant. The session was conducted by M/s Lifeline.



Quality Management System

34 executives participated in 'Internal Auditor Training' was organised in Sutrapada on new ISO 45001:2018 on 4th December 2018. The session was taken by M/s GK Engineers



GHCL Incarnation

One of the most awaited events of the HR department, 'GHCL Incarnation' was organised on 3rd – 4th October 2018 at Sutrapada.

Incarnation is an event that gives an open platform to the employees where they can share their ideas and strategic plans that can be implemented within various areas of operations within the plant and administration.

Incarnation is organised each year on the concept known as 'TEA' (Think-Experiment-Adopt). Best presented ideas during GHCL TEA are sent for participation in Incarnation. This year total 21 ideas were presented by 33 participants.

Mr. R S Jalan, MD GHCL Limited in his speech stated the importance of Innovation and the introduction of the new improved system in the business. He further stated how we at GHCL are working towards this by organising the events like Incarnation where we get new ideas from our colleagues which can be implemented within the organisation and can help improve the productivity level. The presentations selected are mainly in three categories - Strategy, Innovation & Research.

What is Integrated Reporting?

A description of how a company creates value in the long term for all its stakeholders.

Why is Integrated Reporting required?

- Purpose of integrated reporting is to provide shareholders and interested stakeholders (employees, customers, vendors, communities, regulators, etc.) with relevant information that is useful for making investment decisions.
- Integrated reporting is mandatory in few countries like South Africa and has been introduced on voluntary basis from FY18 in India, 2017-18 onwards.

Elements of Integrated Reporting

Integrated Reporting uses 'six capitals' to show how a company creates value over time.

The six capitals



- Financial capital: The funds available to a company for use in the production of goods and obtained through financing or generated through operations or investments.
- Manufactured capital: Manufactured physical assets that are available to an organisation for use in the production of goods or the provision of services.
- Intellectual capital: Organisational, knowledge-based intangibles, such as, patents, R&D knowledge, software etc.
- Human capital: People's competencies, capabilities and experience, and their motivations to innovate.
- Social and relationship capital: The relationships established with the surrounding communities, customers, employees and other stakeholders.
- Natural capital: All renewable and non-renewable environmental resources that provide goods and services that support the company.

Proposed IR journey of GHCL

- GHCL is proactively embarking on its IR journey this year
- The IR effort is being led by a Steering Committee comprising business and functional heads, and coordinated by the Company Secretarial and the Corporate Sustainability
- All four businesses are involved in this initiative and support of employees at all levels is required to make this a success!
