Suspect arrested for Parbhani riots dies in custody after 'chest pain'

Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar: A 35-year-old man arrested in one of the seven cases of rioting and arson triggered by the alleged destruction of a replica of the Constitution in Maharashtra's Parbhani on Dec 11 died in judicial custody Sunday morning after reportedly complaining of severe chest pain.

DIG (Nanded) Shahaji Umap told TOI that Somnath Vyankat Suryavanshi was taken to the district civil hospital where he was declared dead on arrival. Nansalpath police station registered a case of accidental death that will be handed over to CID for further investigation.

Police are also trying to confirm reports suggesting Somnath, from Pune, was a law student in Parbhani, although official records quote him as serving at the time of his arrest that he was a "worker" living in a rented accommodation at Shankarnagar in the Mondha neighbourhood.

Officiating SP Yashant Khatke said police had taken to the local college authorities, seeking information about anybody by that name on the student rolls.

"Suryavanshi was one of the accused arrested during the riots. He, along with other accused, was produced in court Thursday, during which they were remanded in police custody for two days. The court set the suspect in judicial custody Saturday, and they were all shifted to the district jail," Khatke said.

Parbhani SDPO Dinkar Dambale said news of Somnath's death in judicial custody came around 10 am. The body was taken late Sunday to Govt Medical College and Hospital at Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar. A large group of Dalits had gathered outside the hospital by then.
